Guomen Square + Maritime Plaza

The promenade around the Harbor connects the two Squares, where visitors can watch the birds fly around and enjoy the harbor atmosphere, and is a comfortable place to sit down and relax.

2-Minute Walk

YM Oceanic Culture and Art Museum

The building was finished in 1896 and has a history of 127 years, and visitors can come here to learn about Taiwan' maritime history, understand the "current" marine environment, and help protect the "future" of the ocean.

7-Minute Walk

Keelung Landmark

The huge KEELUNG lights is the most eye-catching landmark in Keelung City, as it overlooks the port of Keelung, Keelung Mountain and even Keelung Islet. It is also one of the famous places to enjoy the night view of Keelung.

15-Minute Walk

Commission Store Shopping District

In its heyday, there were as many as 200 so-called "Commission Stores" that specialized in selling imported goods. Even though they are no longer popular, the local youth have worked together to tidy up the area and open up many specialty shops and visitors can feel the vitality and local touch.

15-Minute Walk

Keelung Tower

Keelung Tower is an elevator built from the ground level to reach up the back of Zhupu Altar in the Hope Hill of Zhongzheng Park, which is a convenient path for tourists and citizens to get up to the hill. And it has become an important scenic spot to see the city, the mountains and the sea.

Find Stories in Century-old Temples

Keelung Cheng Huang Temple

It was built in 1818 to enshrine the Chenghuangye symbolizing the protection of the "city wall" and "city moat" and the locals of Keelung regard the Chenghuangye as a deity safeguarding the stability of Keelung. There's a big abacus hung inside the main hall of the temple, which is used as a metaphor to calculate the good and evil in the world, and punish and warn people that wish to do bad in the world.

5-Minute Walk

Qing'an Temple

Mazu is enshrined in this temple, which is a deity widely worshiped in Taiwan and Southeast Asia, and is also the protector of the sea. Qing'an Temple is the oldest temple in Keelung and stone lions sit in front of the temple's exquisitely carved dragon pillars, retaining the splendor of the century-old temple.

3-Minute Walk

Cycling Life Café de MaruCorner

The store is decorated with old items such as bicycles and old tailoring machines, giving it a very retro ambiance. In addition to pour-over coffee, the store also sells tempura and sausage sandwiches that include the local features of Keelung.

9-Minute Walk

Dianji Temple

The "Miao" of Miaokou Night Market means temple in Taiwanese, and Dianji temple, built in the 12th year of Tongzhi Emperor of Qing dynasty (1873), is hidden in the night market. The guardian deity is General Chen Yuan-Guang born around 1300 years ago, was the Sacred King- Developer of Zhangzhou.

9-Minute Walk

Kishida Gofuku Store

This is one of the century-old buildings in Keelung. During the Japanese Colonization era, it was originally the "Kishida Gofuku Store" that made premium kimonos. The building's elegant Victorian-style exterior is a representation of the prosperous times and it is full of historical and cultural charm.

12-Minute Walk

Zhongzheng Park

The white Guanyin Statue in the park is 22.5 meters high and can be climbed to get a panoramic view of Keelung, making it the most representative landmark of Keelung City. There are two huge golden lions sitting on both sides of the Guanyin statue, which is very auspicious and dignified. The elevated square at the highest point overlooking Keelung provides a beautiful panoramic view of the Port at night.

Recommend Souvenirs from Keelung

Unique Century-old Stores of Keelung

Lee Hu Cake Shop

All kinds of traditional Taiwanese cakes, such as pineapple cakes, egg yolk cakes and curry cakes are must-buy souvenirs when visiting Keelung.

Lianzhen Pastry

The pastry sells a series of taro desserts such as taro balls, pudding cake, and double-layer taro cakes that often attract crowds of people queuing up to buy them.

Chuan-Li Rice Cookie

"Rice" is expanded using heat and then pressed into blocks to make rice cookies, which are a very traditional snack in Taiwan that have a unique taste, and are also known as "Taiwanese popcorn."

Klijinxing Mua Lau

The long base is made of rice and malt, and the outer layer is wrapped with sesame or peanuts. It has a crispy and fluffy texture and is a traditional rice product in Taiwan.

Zhenweixiang Bakery

The Emperor's Pie sold in the Bakery is the best-selling product of Keelung's top ten souvenirs, and is a Taiwanese pie that layers upon layers of texture and flavors. In addition, the handmade sachima is crisp, soft, puffy and crunchy as it's another popular product for the Bakery.

Bonjour Bakery & Cafe

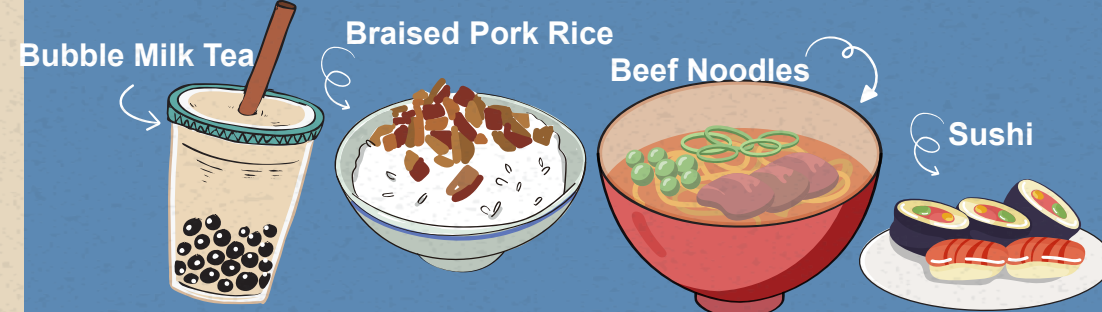
The almond crisps made from local Keelung seafood have a local touch to them and the mixed fruit jam and tofu cotton cheesecake are also well-known products.

Hot Pot
